
2nd Amendment: The Right to Bear Arms

Background/History

- The 2nd Amendment was adopted on December 15, 1791.
- The 2nd Amendment is one of the 10 Amendments that are considered the Bill of Rights.
- The 2nd Amendment protects the rights of the people to bear arms in the United States.
- The language used in the amendment has been subject to much debate on its meaning.



"A well-regulated militia, being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed."

Why Is It Important?

- The importance of the second amendment is the ability to rebel against a tyrannical government.
- It also gives citizens the right to protect themselves, without restrictions from the government.
- The Second Amendment also allows us to protect ourselves from foreign and domestic attacks, if the government won't.



Controversies

- Modern debates about the Second Amendment are centered around the language used in the amendment.
- The controversy is about whether it protects an individual's right to keep and bear arms or only applies to militia organizations such as the National Guard.
- Some argue that adding more gun regulation laws would reduce gun deaths while others think that gun ownership deters crime.
- This is a heavily debated topic that people have extremely strong opinions on and will continue to argue about in the future.
