Protecting Children

KEEP YOUR KIDS

- Children's websites must protect kids privacy
- ▶ Private information information that can identify YOU
- ▶ **Privacy policy** a legal document that explains how a website gathers and uses your private information
- ➤ Seal of Approval a sign or stamp that states that a website, company, or group meets a certain set of standards and is doing a good job.

Private Information Revisited

- ► Full name
- ► Home Address
- ▶ Phone Number
- ► School name or address

- ► Email Address *
- ► Social Security Number (SSN)
- **▶** Birthday
- **▶** Passwords

* May be required to register to a website

COPPA

is an Acronym for

Children's Online Privacy Protection Act

- ▶ United States law requires website owners to protect the private information of children 13 and younger.
 - ► Has content meant for kids 13 and younger
 - ► Asks kids for private information
- ▶ Purpose is to protect kid's personal (identifiable) information
- Website must post a link to a privacy policy
 - ▶ *It must be clear and prominent*
 - Explain how the website protects children's privacy and safety
- ▶ BBB and TRUSTe review children's websites to make sure they are protecting kids.
 - ► Their seals of approval may be on the site
