#### REVOLVING LOAN FUND

Insufficient finances have frequently prevented our graduates from pursuing college careers. As a special feature of our 75th Anniversary, the Alumni Association inaugurated a REVOLVING LOAN FUND to help worthy students achieve a college education. The Fund will permit S. H. S. graduates to borrow funds for their college education, to be repaid over a period of five years after graduation from college, or termination for any reason, of their college careers.

Last year we had some confusion in terminology between the Revolving Loan Fund and the Scholarship Fund. A number of contributions were received and credited the Scholarship Fund, but later we learned they were intended for the Revolving Fund, which resulted in some omissions in

Classes receiving credit for contributions.

A considerable sum of money will be required to establish a worthwhile

Revolving Loan Fund and the goal of \$75,000.00 has been set.

To avoid further confusion and to accelerate the acquisition of our goal, the following resolution was adopted by the Executive Committee:

WHEREAS, the S. H. S. Alumni Association has inaugurated a Revolving Loan Fund to aid our graduates in pursuing college careers, and

WHEREAS, the tentative goal of \$75,000.00 has been set, BE IT RESOLVED, that the entire fund raising efforts of S. H. S. Alumni Association be directed to the establishment of the Revolving Loan Fund.

Resolution adopted.

In accordance with the above resolution, it is therefore understood that all cash presentations by decennial classes, will, this year and for the next four years, be applied to the Revolving Loan Rund, unless specifically designated otherwise at the time of presentation.

It has been established with the U.S. Department of Revenue, that all gifts to the Educational Fund are deductible for Income Tax purposes.

In order to promote contributions and memorials to this Fund, three Clubs, similar to The Century Club have been established—THE \$1,000 CLUB, THE \$500 CLUB, THE \$100 CLUB. Of course, contributions of any amount will be gratefully received for this worthy cause, and will be duly
