## ROBERT ALFRED KEMP

Class of 1935

**BORN**, Shamokin, Pa., November 2, 1916. Elder son of Alfred and Ruth (Dreisbach) Kemp.

**ENTERED** public schools and was graduated from Shamokin High School in 1935.

**IDENTIFIED** himself early in life with Scouting and availed himself of training afforded for the development of essential qualities of character.

**HELD** in highest esteem by fellow students and teachers alike throughout his entire scholastic career.

**DEFENDED** the honor of his Alma Mater in the field of Wrestling during his High School days, as undefeated Champion for four years and Captain during his Senior year. Winner of the Middle Atlantic States Championship at a tournament held at Lehigh University.

**ENROLLED** at Washington & Lee University where he proved himself an outstanding student, and was graduated with honors in 1939. At W. & L. he duplicated his earlier High School record both as Wrestler and Captain. Held Southern Intercollegiate Championship three years.

**ENLISTED** in the service of his Country and received training at Westover Field, Massachusetts. Assigned to active duty in the British war area as Radio Operator on a Bomber and was killed in action, August 11, 1942.

**DIED** a hero, and news of his death was despatched to his parents by the War Department.

**Scout; Scholar; Athlete; Soldier:** Thus is epitomized a life of achievement by one who did not esteem that life too dear to lay it down for his Country and for the Great Cause which he had espoused.
