\$1,000 WILLED TO SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Shamokin High School Alumni Association acknowledges with thanks and a deep feeling of gratitude a bequest of \$1,000 made to the Association's Scholarship Fund by a late alumnus.

THE SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Scholarship Fund was started May 17, 1922. This year marks the 40th year since its inception.

Two changes which should be very

gratifying to members of the Senior Class, have been inaugurated. First, a new award will be given to the student receiving the third highest average in the competitive examination, in the amount of \$400 over a period of four years. Second, the student who receives the second highest average will receive the sum of \$600 over a period of four years. This award had been \$400. The Senior receiving the highest average in this same examination will, as heretofore, receive \$1,000 over the four year period. The awards are paid to the college or school which the student selects as his or her point of matriculation. The fund from which the awards are made, known as the S.H.S. Alumni Scholarship Fund, has been acquired from contributions from members of the Alumni. Only the income from the fund is used. The principal remains in a Trust Fund and will contribute the income in perpetuity. The Fund currently stands at \$63,493.21.

SUGGEST A NAME

Officers of the Alumni Association have decided to re-name the Revolving Loan Fund Century Club and are seeking the help of Association Members in finding a new name.

The Fund is separate from The Century Club whose members are composed of those graduates who contribute \$100 to the Scholarship Fund.

The so-called Revolving Loan Century Club was set up to provide cash loans to Shamokin High graduates who are in need of financial help to further their education in a college or university.

CLASS REUNION NEWS

Lone Survivor, Class of 1892

There were seventeen members in the 1892 graduating class, Shamokin High School. We were few in numbers, strong in response, to our teachings. Class reunions were not in vogue in that era of years ago, but there was always maintained through the passing years a good fellowship inspired by high school friendships. There were only three grades of study: Freshman, Junior and Senior—the educational values of which were readily absorbed. Despite its limited number, the class contributed to the world at large a corporation attorney, a district attorney for Luzerne County, a member of the Governor's Troop during the Spanish-American War, an af-

filiate of two major coal operations, and Myron D. Edmunds, a feature writer for the Philadelphia Inquirer. The class representative, together with Myron D. Edmunds, alternated by student election as editors of the first Shamokin High School paper. The news items were collected by the editors, written on legal cap paper and read by the student editor at the Friday afternoon exercises of the entire school assembly.

After the thirst for education had been thoroughly satisfied, resort was made to a huge tin bucket with copper purifying straps in the bottom, and a long necked dipper in it. When the students thirst had been quenched, the question came up, "What should be done with the balance of the water in the dipper?" There being no other container in sight, the water was promptly poured back into the bucket.

We wish the Class of 1962 a full measure of the success that beckons from the closely competitive years just ahead.
