Claude H. Readly Resigns School Post

When Claude H. Readly, Jr., resigns as superintendent of Shamokin Area Public Schools June 30, he will bring to an end a career as a teacher and administrator that has spanned 35 years.

Mr. Readly, a graduate of Shamokin High School, tendered his resignation to the board of education on January 10 and the directors accepted it with regret.

After a career of teaching, Mr. Readly was appointed high school principal and served in this capacity for six years. He was elected superintendent in 1967, succeeding Paul A. Swank.

Mr. Readly was graduated from Shamokin High School in 1927. He acquired a bachelor of science degree in electrical engineering at Penn State University in 1933. He earned a master of science degree at Penn State in 1948, also, in the field of vocational industrial education. He took additional work at Bloomsburg State College, Bucknell University and Lehigh University.

As an instructor, Mr. Readly taught mathematics, science and industrial arts. He taught national defense classes for the school district and Penn State University. He served as subject matter supervisor for Penn State during the summer of 1942 for graduate high school students under the science, management and war training programs during World War II in communications engineering for the Army Signal Corps. He attained the rating of technical sergeant while serving in the army during World War II.

Mr. Readly is a former member of Shamokin City Council, having served eight years with the governmental body. He is a past president of Shamokin Area Education Association, past president of Pennsylvania State Education Association, Northeast District, and was a mem-

Progress Report On Vo-Tech School After First Year

Northumberland County Area Vo-Tech School is closing out its first year of operation, serving students of three public schools and one parochial institution.

The school is operated and supported by the school districts of Shamokin Area, Mount Carmel Area and Line Mountain. Through an arrangement with the State department of Education, students of Lourdes Regional High School attend vo-tech classes, also.

More than 600 students—female as well as male—attend the vo-tech school. They are provided a training to meet the demands for high skilled workers needed to operate the high level of sophistication in modern day equipment. These same workers are also academically educated.

The vo-tech philosophy is that vo-tech graduates have an excellent opportunity for a successful life and of becoming good, productive citizens. A "perfect marriage" is taught by tying vo-tech training in with academic instructions. These are required through mechanical aptitude, manual skills and technical knowledge.

Mechanical aptitude is the ability which enables a student to work efficiently with mechanical objects; manual skills, to develop skills with hand tools, and technical knowledge which directs the effective appreciation of their manual skills and upgrades and broadens their aptitudes.

With the opening of the vo-tech school for the 1973-74 term, the administration added food management, production and services and textile productions and fabrication of its long list of subjects.

Other courses offered are automobile mechanics, carpentry, distributive education, radio and television, cosmetology, electrical, welding, machine, masonry, electrical technology, warehousing, sheet metal, heating, scientific data processing, automobile body and fender, automobile specialization, mechanical drafting and design and agriculture.

School officials point out the institution is geared for the change in our bridge to the new age of nuclear power. Human energy must be translated into human capacity to master new techniques and new mechanisms, they point out.

The vo-tech school was approved by the Department of Education in 1962, and it was effective as of June, 1963. After a long period of preparation, negotiating and planning, the school became a reality and was opened for the 1972-73 term.

Details on New Shamokin High School

The new Shamokin Area High School, that is being constructed on a sloping hillside south of the school's football stadium at former Edgewood Park, is being built at a cost of more than \$9 million.

There is a bare possibility the school will be ready for the start of the 1974-75 school term. This depends on the flow of supplies and materials needed in construction. If these vital items are delayed, the school will not be ready until the following year.

The new school will be three stories high facing Faust Road (south), and four stories high facing the football stadium. Two roads are being constructed to the building, one from an area near the stadium and the other from Faust Road, which is a continuation of a street leading from Fairview in west Coal Township. A parking area will be available to accommodate 400 cars.

The ground floor will be entered at grade on the side facing Kemp Memorial Field (the stadium). The ground floor will include two dining areas.

One of the features of the new school will be an Olympic size swimming pool with seating arrangements for 180 persons, and girls' and boys' locker rooms. Nearby will be a faculty dining area, special education

and industrial arts departments and administration offices.

The main entrance will be from the Faust Road (to the south). On this floor will be a gymnasium covering 13,600 square feet and with a seating capacity of 3,000 spectators. An auxiliary gym and remedial gym are included on this floor, also, as are team rooms, lockers and a lobby.

Key area on this first floor will be an auditorium with a seating capacity for 950, plus a balcony that will accommodate 300 persons. In all areas removable walls will provide for flexibility in the size of classrooms which will provide for "open space" or "closed space" teaching.

The second floor will contain student activities areas, classrooms, library, social studies department, television studio and the auditorium balcony that can be converted into a room for instruction.

Science and mathematics departments will be on the third floor. In addition, there will be space for a planetarium dome and an observatory. Faculty rooms and a 200-square foot greenhouse for biology students will be installed on the top floor, also.

The entire building will contain 23,000 square feet of space and will provide modern accommodations and facilities for 1,250 students.
