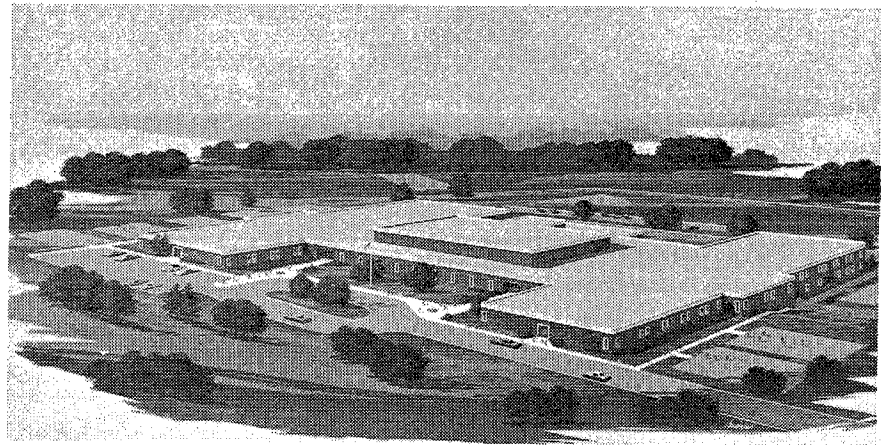

SHAMOKIN AREA ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Newest Educational Facility Dedicated January 20, 1980

"There's a good feeling here. The children appreciate their school and so do I."

Mrs. Ginny Thornburgh, wife of Gov. Dick Thornburgh, expressed her pride during brief remarks dedicating Shamokin's new elementary School.

"There's no litter here, no vandalism and no marks," the speaker told a large crowd of area residents. It was obvious Mrs. Thornburgh was impressed with the facility following an earlier tour of the building conducted by four elementary students. A number of administrators accompanied her on the tour.

Mrs. Thornburgh aimed much of her remarks toward the section of the structure used by the Central Susquehanna Intermediate Unit (CSIU) for handicapped and retarded children.

"Take pride in your handicapped students," the speaker advised. "You and I have much more ability. We use approximately one-third of our

ability, while handicapped and retarded use 90 percent of theirs."

Dr. Daniel C. Witmer, superintendent of Shamokin Area Schools, presided during the program, calling the day a "Super Sunday," noting the super weather and the super school.

"I am very proud of the potential of this school for education. I believe in neighborhood schools, but I forget when I enter this building." The superintendent said neighborhood schools could never provide the facilities available in the new building.

Frank VanDevender, former superintendent of schools, presented the symbolic shovel to Lyman Weaver, assistant elementary principal. "All of us have goals, some border on dreams. This is an academic goal come true," VanDevender said.

"It was a gratifying experience working toward the goal," VanDevender added. Weaver said "the students are happy" in the new school.

Dr. Witmer commended the elementary school orchestra and choral group, noting the orchestra is one of the new fourth and fifth grade orchestras in the state. The orchestra was directed by Charles Robel and

In conclusion, Dr. Witmer explained the new school has "potential for excellence," and asked all taxpayers to join in the challenge.

Building tours were conducted following the ceremonies under the direction of the elementary school PTA, Doris Ziemba, president. A large crowd of residents took advantage of the tours.

The \$5.8 million structure has a present pupil occupancy of 1,450. It includes 45 regular classrooms, special education rooms, library, gymnasium and numerous other special sections not available in most schools.

the choral group by Nan Weller.

Roger Altemose of Altemose Construction Co., Center Square, general contractor, presented the building to Boyd C. Wagner, architect. Wagner said the project was "not an immensely popular one" back in 1975 when it began, but administrators who made the decision to build should be commended. He said the building was built with 1977 dollars.

Keys to the building were presented by Wagner to Paul L. Eveland, school board president; Thomas E. Sanders, elementary principal; Dr. Patrick F. Toole, executive director CSIU-16, and to Lisa Grow, fifth grade student.

Dr. Toole complimented district residents for their "fierce pride" in their community and children. He gave a report on progress made for handicapped students in Shamokin during the last nine years.

"Handicapped students are our collective responsibility," Dr. Toole stated "and they can't be given proper help in church basements and in old abandoned schools."

Eveland said education is under attack and education is not cheap. "You must be willing to pay for a sound education system," the board president added.

Sanders noted the "good planning" that went into the new building. He outlined the numerous advantages of the ultra-modern building. Sanders said the district seeks a safe environment for the children and welcomed constructive criticism from parents.

The Rev. Woodrow W. Jones, pastor of St. Edward's Church, gave the invocation; Rev. Thomas J. Truitt, Paxinos Area United Methodist Parish, gave the dedication prayer and the Rev. Ronald A. Sparks, Seventh Street Primitive Methodist Church, offered the benediction.

The speaker was presented with gifts, including a coal bucket planter. "That's what it's all about," she said in referring to the coal.



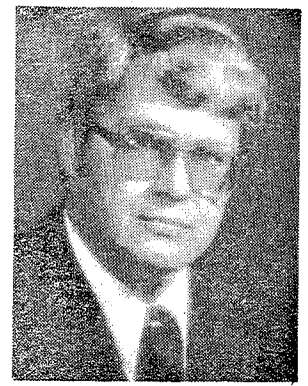

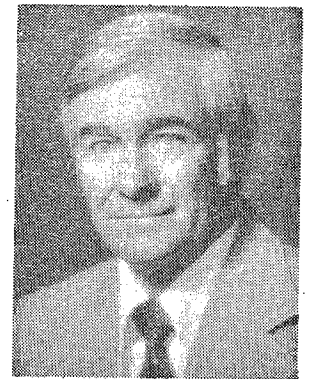

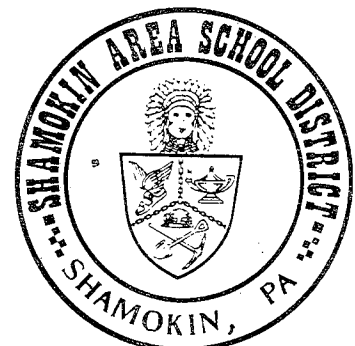
